Selected by the Y's Board of Directors, following a 5-month search, Bevan will succeed Kathy Viens who is embarking on retirement. In his new role Conor Bevan will be responsible for positioning the Y as a vital partner for community change, implementing a strategic plan, fiscal management and more.

While there, Conor has increased total youth served and average daily attendance by 85%, received national recognition for organizational safety standards, and formally launched three new program focus areas rooted in DEI, STEAM, & Workforce Readiness across 9 sites. Prior to his current role, Conor has held leadership roles at Boys & Girls Club of Greater Holyoke, Springfield Boys & Girls Clubs, Berkshire Health Systems, and as a civilian lead contractor for the Navy. Conor holds a Bachelor's degree from Skidmore College and a Master's in Public Administration in Non-Profit Management from New York University.
